Billing Aquadrome

The VBOA stages an annual rally at Billing Aquadrome in Northampton. The Rally regularly attracts over 2,000 vehicles covering 80 or more years of manufacturing history. Now in its nineteenth year, the rally has become a key event in the Vauxhall enthusiast's calendar and is the largest Vauxhall/Opel rally in Europe. Billing also hosts a very popular Autojumble where enthusiasts can search for rare or unusual parts for their vehicles.

Importantly, this rally and those staged by the individual clubs, clearly demonstrate the level of interest in Vauxhall vehicles both past and present, as well as the commitment of the enthusiasts and their clubs.

The V.B.O.A won the "Most Improved Club Award" presented by Classic Car Magazine in 1997. The trophy is now proudly displayed in Vauxhall's Heritage Centre in Luton.

Vauxhall 4x4 Club

The Vauxhall 4x4 Club was formed to help drivers gain further knowledge and experience of driving 4x4's in a safe environment and to get the most from their offroad vehicle. Expert advice and practical encouragement is aimed at significantly improving the drivers' competence and help them to master treacherous driving conditions. Guidance is also provided for routine 4x4 driving situations such as towing a trailer or launching a boat from a slipway, confidently and safely.

If a second and third place is reserved for the same day, these cost £80 and £60 respectively. Importantly, fees are refunded if the candidate buys a Frontera or Brava 4x4 within 12 months. The Club has its own fleet of 4x4 Fronteras based at convenient locations around the UK, so it is not necessary to own a 4x4 to take part in the Training day.
